Expectations:

1. Follow class rules. These are posted in the room and students have received a copy as well.
2. Pay attention in class. I will be giving students directions and leading class discussions. Lack of attention will cause students to miss important assignments, directions, announcements and information.
3. Students will be required to keep two separate notebooks, one for reading and one for English. These will be used for notes, discussion questions and writing responses.
4. Students will need to be active participants in class discussions and activities. I will always ask for group and individual class work to be turned in so I can assess student understanding and comprehension.
5. Written homework will be given several nights of the week. Students will be asked to keep track of these assignments and turn them on time. Per the class rules and class information passed out of the beginning of the year any late or incomplete work will be have half points taken off.
6. Writing is important in 7th grade Language Arts. The students will be asked to use the writing process to complete their assignments; this means that written assignments should be edited and spell check before they are turned in. The other steps of the process will take place in class.
7. Studying for test and quizzes are important for student success. I will always inform students a week before a test or quiz will be given. This includes vocabulary as well. There is no excuse for not being prepared.

Expectations:

1. See above Language Arts Expectations.
2. My biggest concern with Social Studies is reading. Students must complete assigned reading and the accompanying work if they are to be successful in this class. Reading will be our basis for class discussion and notes. Students will always have a guided note taking activity to do with the reading.
3. "Pop" quizzes are to be expected after reading is assigned!
4. Long term assignments and tests will be announced. I will give one weeks notice for tests, along with a study guide and at least one class day devoted to review.
5. Long term projects will be announced and explained with set time line for completion.

Materials, class format, and grading are similar to the description found in the Language Arts section of this sheet.

** There will be research projects assigned during the course of the year. These projects will entail written and creative aspects based on research. Class time is always devoted to research and development of a project.

** There will be semester exams in Social Studies. 7th will use an exam schedule to assess the students at the end of each semester (end of 2nd and 4th quarters). Exams will be cumulative for the semester. There will be study guides!
